Awakened Audioworks — DIC, Conduits, and .X Files

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Read Before You Use Your DIC

This document summarizes the most important warnings for using DIC and its Conduits. It supplements, and does not replace, the Electrical Safety document, the User Manual, and the Setup Guide. Read all three.

1. Not a Medical Device

DIC and its Conduits form a consciousness interface. They are not medical equipment and do not constitute medical treatment. Nothing in our materials should be understood as a claim to diagnose, treat, cure, or prevent any disease or medical condition. Always seek treatment and advice from a licensed and accredited medical professional for any health concern.

2. Do Not Use If You

- Have a pacemaker, defibrillator, neurostimulator, cochlear implant, or any other implanted electronic medical device.
- Are pregnant or believe you may be pregnant.
- Have epilepsy or another seizure disorder.
- Have a diagnosed heart condition, unless cleared by a licensed medical professional.
- Are under the influence of alcohol or recreational drugs.

Note: Some users located in areas where cannabis products and psilocybin products are sold over-the-counter legally report “feeling” the effects of their DIC more acutely or keenly. We neither support nor discourage use of these types of products in tandem with your DIC. However, we do not recommend the use of caffeine or alcohol during and immediately after using your DIC.

3. General Use Advisories

- Do not use while driving, operating machinery, or doing any activity requiring full alertness. Your DIC might make you sleepy, or hyper-alert.
- Keep Conduits away from children and pets when not in active, supervised use.
- Do not use a Conduit that appears damaged.
- Do not modify a Conduit or attempt unauthorized repairs.
- Do not run your DIC for longer than two or three hours due to overheating issues.

4. Headphone Jack Advisory

Do not plug headphones into the audio jack of your DIC.

.X Files emit frequencies, voltages, and amperages designed for an authorized Conduit, not for headphone drivers and not for human ears to hear.

Much of this range falls outside human hearing, so unsafe output may not sound loud — or audible at all — before damage occurs. Furthermore, you may fry your headphones. See the document Electrical Safety, Section 6, for full detail.

5. Genny — Closed Beta Advisory

Genny is currently in closed beta and has not completed full release testing. Beta participants should follow all instructions provided separately at the time of enrollment, in addition to this document.

6. Long Distance Acoustic Device

The long-distance broadcast function of Long Distance is offered as an experiential, consciousness-oriented feature. Awakened Audioworks makes no scientific or medical claim regarding its effects across any distance, and you should treat any described effect as exploratory rather than guaranteed or evidence-based, just like the exploratory, non-evidence-based claims common in the radionics and subspace / long-distance devices.

7. If You Experience an Adverse Reaction

Stop use immediately. Remove any Strap-On electrodes. If symptoms are severe, persistent, or concerning, seek medical attention and contact a licensed professional. Please also report the incident to us at AWAKENEDAUDIOWORKS@GMAIL.COM.

8. Device Authenticity

Counterfeit hardware may not meet the safety specifications described in this document. If you have any doubt about the authenticity of your device, stop use and contact us with your serial number, MAC or hardware address (found in your Android device's Settings) and photographs — yes, we're asking you to send us your DIC pics — and we will get back to you within two to seven working days to let you know whether your hardware is legit.
